Welcome to Sunny Camp Mack

We have come to the beginning of the new camp season and we have found several opportunities to move this ministry forward but we need some help. The first project is in the Auditorium. We would like to replace the lights in the back half with new LED Bay lights. The cost of lights and wire is around \$4000. The second project is the lower roof of the auditorium. We started last fall by removing the shingles from 1/3 of one side and replacing a good bit of the plywood. We then put on new felt and it wintered that way. We now need to roof that portion. The cost will be about \$2500. The third project we are looking at is updating our internet connections. When a large retreat group comes and uses their cell phones and at the same time the leadership wants to download something we run out of capacity to do all of that. The cost of that project is ____. The fourth project is camperships. Last year we spent \$19,079 to help kids come to camp. That money all came from gifts. Our campership fund is currently at \$16,300. We anticipate the need to be a little bit greater this year than last. The last project I want to lift up today is the 400 Club. The Board started that drive to reduce the mortgage on the John Kline Center last spring. The response was wonderful. We reduced the debt from \$411,000 to \$96,562 today. We all did a little happy dance for that! It would really be nice to eliminate this debt before we move forward.

Five possibilities! Each project helps to create this "Sanctuary experience" here at Camp Mack. Do any of these touch your heart strings? Come join us as we prepare for a new season of kids escaping from the values of the world to a sanctuary where they can begin to connect with God.

What is Cookin' from the Kitchen

Spring is a busy time here at Camp Mack. Today we have a group of volunteers from one of our 12 step recovery groups. This colorful group of people may not be the kind of people who come to mind when you think of a church camp but these special people have experienced God as they have spent time here at Camp Mack. They have experienced our mission statement on a real and personal level. It is a blessing to be able to form relationships with these men and women who have come to love this place and who demonstrate that love through service.

The Camp Alexander Mack Mission Statement:

“A Sanctuary where people connect with God through Faith Formation, Experiencing Creation, and Building Christian Community.”

May is here and I am planning menus for the upcoming weeks and the various groups that we are preparing for here at Camp Mack. As I think of spring time and of course food, I think of the foods that I associate with spring. If I were to ask you “What is the most common food that comes to mind?” Many of you would say **Morel's**. Just yesterday Mr. Ray brought me a nice sized Morel that he found while mowing the lawn here at Camp.

Another springtime food that we use quite a bit of here at camp is rhubarb. Last year a friend of Camp Mack from the Nappanee Church of the Brethren donated a 5 gallon bucket of rhubarb plants that are established and doing well in one of our raised garden beds. By next year we will be able to begin harvesting our own Camp Mack rhubarb.

The following recipe is growing in popularity, and was given to me by a member of the Maple Grove congregation. Hope you enjoy it.

RHUBARB OAT DESSERT Serves 12

In a large bowl mix: 1 ½ cups flour, 1 ½ cups old fashion oatmeal, 1 cup packed brown sugar, ½ cup chopped walnuts, ¼ teaspoon baking soda, ¼ teaspoon salt, 1 cup cold oleo (margarine) Mix dry ingredients then cut oleo into the dry ingredients until crumbly. Press 3 cups of this mixture into a 9X13 glass baking dish. Set aside. Then soak 3 cups fresh sliced or frozen rhubarb in 1 cup of cold water for 3 minutes. Drain.

In a sauce pan combine: ¼ cup of cold water, 1 ½ cups sugar, 3 Tablespoons corn starch, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, ½ teaspoon red food coloring. Add rhubarb and bring to a boil. Cook and stir for 5 minutes until thickened. Spoon topping over the prepared crust. Sprinkle remaining crumbs over the top.

Bake at 350 for 23 to 25 minutes or until golden brown. NOTE...Serve warm with ice cream. It's yummy! This will stay crisp longer if you use a glass pan. And you can see the pretty color better in a glass pan.

TONY'S NOTE: At home I like to make this with more rhubarb so I double the filling. I also like more crumbles on top so I make another ½ recipe of the crumbles to sprinkle over the top.




South Central Woman's Camp
