# Welcome to Sunny Camp Mack

As most of you know we received an estate gift from the Bigler family last year. The I.C.B. decided to spend \$55,000 of that money on a concrete floor for the Auditorium. That really changed the looks of Q.M. It became apparent that we needed to upgrade some other things in there. Lynn Kreider led a crew of volunteers this winter in making the short wall dividing the two areas. They also built some hand rails for the two new ramps and for the existing steps to the stage. For several years we have had a blue tarp covering the storage area to the south of the stage. It became readily apparent that this tarp would not fit the new décor! Our volunteer crew built a very nice new wall to match the short wall in the middle of our new space. During the process of pouring the concrete we took off the old doors just under the front of the stage. Lynn's crew built new panels to replace the old doors to match the new wall. The change in the appearance of our auditorium is dramatic. We just had our first wedding in this new space and it all looked beautiful. Last month we laid out the need for new lighting in the back half of QM. That need was met and I have purchased new lights. Hopefully we can install them this summer. These improvements have highlighted some other issues we need to work at in the Auditorium. One would be the Murals. I need to find someone with some expertise to guide us forward. The second issue we are facing is the Good Shepherd window. We have been missing some pieces but recently we discovered it is starting to bow and buckle in a couple of places. I had a man who repairs stain glass windows take a look at it. He felt the old frame is rotting away and some of the lead connecting the window to the stiffeners is gone. Therefore we have a window starting to sag. At some point it becomes dangerous to leave it in place. He estimated the cost of repair and cleaning of the window would be in the \$25,000 to \$35,000 range. We would make the new frame just like we did for the Rose window. This window is a beautiful part of that building. This project is beyond our capacity to fund at this time. Would a group of us be willing to fund the restoration of the Good Shepherd Window?

#### Be Our Guest

For many persons coming to Camp Mack it is a time to get away from the distractions that we have every day, with our phones and computers. There are other persons able to come to a retreat, or help as a counselor or lead in one of our rental camps, if they are able to access their email or work at their college courses, tests and a myriad of other details with their businesses. We also now have groups that use our Wi-Fi to stream services or to have a speaker from another country, or another part of the United States as their speaker. Some rental camps can work with their registration process as campers arrive. We have groups that get on the internet for Scrapbooking and Quilting retreats, or organizations and churches that need to download information pertinent to the retreat they are leading. We have groups that do research for retreats as well. We want to meet the needs of the groups and individuals now coming and those new groups that are contemplating using our facility that need the upgraded technology they rely upon. I say all of this to let you know that the Wi-Fi system that was put in place over 7 years ago is no longer meeting expectations of our guests. We have recently worked with a company for an upgrade including burying fiber optic cable from John Kline to the Quinter-Miller Auditorium that would give us the upgrade we need for many years to come. We would also upgrade our access points in our lodges and Quinter-Miller Auditorium and John Kline to allow bandwidth for leadership and for guests and many other options. The cost of the upgrade would be around \$25,000 that we do not have in our budget. We are asking for donations from groups and individuals to help make this happen. If you have been one of the persons that enjoyed the benefit of free Wi-Fi at Camp Mack and want to continue those advantages would you help us spread the word of our need and help us with a gift of any amount ear marked for the Wi-Fi upgrade project?

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# **Indiana Camp Board**

In the past couple of years the camp board has worked through difficult decisions regarding staffing and financial stability in order to preserve and enhance the ministry of Camp Mack. At the same time we have taken steps to clarify our role as a governance board and strengthen our ability to work together effectively.

Two years ago, the camp faced a debt of \$400,000. A major effort has been made to pay off this debt by the "400 Club" of donors. Thanks to the hard work of the board, and the support of many friends of Camp Mack, this debt is now reduced to \$96,000.00.

In this time of transition, Galen Jay has given excellent service as Executive Director. He has worked closely with the camp board and the rest of the staff to improve the financial situation and maintain facilities while continuing the camp's mission of outdoor ministry.

The board has been consulting with Becky Ball-Miller to recognize its appropriate governance role and equip ourselves to fulfil that role. The board has also worked with Bob Gross to develop healthy practices for dealing with differences and enabling all members to participate fully in the board's work.

Throughout this time of transition, the camp's mission of providing a sanctuary for people to come and experience God's presence and love has continued to bless all those who enter its gates.
