I want to take a little time today and thank the "Camp family" for all you do for this ministry we all call Camp Mack. Last week we were able to write a check to the Lake City bank for \$16,000. This is above our regular payment on our mortgage on the JKWC. We could do that because of your generous giving last month to the "400" club. We started 2015 with a loan balance of \$411,000 and in April the ICB began the 400 Club with the intent of finding 400 people who would give \$1000 each to eliminate the loan. Today that balance is \$78,836. In a little over a years' time we have reduced the debt a by \$332,164. Now that is progress and time for a little happy dance on all our parts!

The other thanks I want to lift up today are your wonderful response to our need for volunteers. We have three full weeks of Brethren camps and we were short some counselors. We now have two of the three weeks filled with counselors. We also had a very nice response of volunteers for the kitchen and the facility/housekeeping crews. We had over ten volunteers at different times last week. During the Brethren weeks we put such a load on our staff because of all the programing we do. Our days start at 6:00 AM in the kitchen and end as late as 10:30 PM with night hikes. This makes for some long days and tired staff. When we have volunteers help, we can give a break to some of our staff. This is a big lift. Thanks for your help and keep it coming!

I want to close with thanks to our great summer staff. We have eight summer staff and two summer supervisors this year. Of the ten, six are returning summer staff and all of them have come up through Brethren summer camps. They believe in the mission of Camp Mack," a sanctuary where people connect with God", and are working hard at making that happen.



A Quiet Place



Have you ever met anyone who said, "I just don't want to grow. I want to stay right where I am, forever." And if you have, you know they are out of luck because, like plants, human beings are either growing or dying. Most of us can relate to feeling "stuck" at times, but it isn't a place a person can live for long.

The movement toward growth is constant and persistent. We can't force it. But we can get in its way. Finding the balance between what our part is in the process and what isn't is an interesting adventure!

In the course of Jesus sharing the Parable of the Growing Seed in Mark 4:26-29 he says something that especially strikes me. Referring to the soil

in which a seed is planted Jesus says, "All by itself the soil produces grain – first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head."

"All by itself." Really. Whatever good thing comes about all by itself?!

We are so used to making things happen. If we aren't making something happen, it seems nothing is happening. I often hear overloaded children of God protesting when others suggest they let go of something, "But if I don't do it, nobody will!" Of course the automatic assumption behind that is that would be bad. The other assumption is that one actually knows what will happen when one steps back, in terms of what others will do.

So maybe our part is to be aware of where the "good soil" for the soul is, the place where, as we spend time in it, maybe doing "nothing", growth happens, where something seems to be coming forth all by itself.

A Quiet Place is one of those places that offer the fertile soil of rest and silence, space away from demands and others voices, so that one can be aware of one's inner voice, the voice of God. And it also offers opportunity, through Creating Community groups, to gather with others who are longing for the same thing.
