It's easy to become distracted and unfocused. One thing I realize is that if I don't have my time to just "be", I really lose my focus on what's important. I know my daily faith-walk with God must be paramount. But I can become so industrious that I displace my way of centering.

I'm reminded of Luke 10:38-42, where Mary recognized the need to just be with Jesus and learn at his feet. Certainly tasks at hand, like the food her sister was preparing, were necessary. I don't believe Jesus was criticizing
