
Be Our Guest

I wanted to let each of you know of my intention to retire at the end of August 2017. So as I write this I have 9 months left at Camp Mack. I wanted to reflect a bit in this issue of the newsletter about what the past 38 years have meant to me. I will be reflecting more in the next issues of the newsletter between now and August.

I think back to the day I was directing a 6th grade camp in the summer of 1979 and was making a phone call in the office to set up some interviews for new employment because the company I was working for was going to close its doors. A few hours later Arden Ball came looking for me on his golf cart and wanted to see if I might have interest in working at Camp Mack as the Maintenance Director. I told him I would pray about it. I remember vividly having a conversation with God in the Shultz Chapel that day or the next and it felt that God was opening the door to camp and I remember being a bit like Gideon in Joshua 6 telling God that I really need a sign or a bit more to know for sure. On Sunday, following the 6th grade camp, I remember so well not what exactly Kenneth Hollinger's (my pastor at Maple Grove) sermon text was, but the fact that he talked about following God when he prompts us and opens doors. I knew then that the fleece was wet and said ok God, I will call Arden. I asked Kenneth if he knew what an influence he had on my decision with the words he spoke that Sunday. Kenneth did not but as we spoke about it numerous times after that, he was very pleased because of his love of Camp Mack and the understanding he had of the ministry here and the way that lives are changed.



Arden Ball had a huge impact on my longevity at Camp Mack because of the leader he was as the Executive Director of Camp Mack. He was interested in the ministry of Camp Mack and also the ministry of each staff person. He was an encourager and also was a person that wanted things done right so that as each person came through the entrance they were safe and could feel the love of God from the environment and the staff. A few years after I started at Camp Mack in the early 1980's Arden thought we needed to "spruce" up the corner of 1150 and Camp Mack Road and also give directions to the camp. So as the head of maintenance at the time, I dug up a couple little spruce trees from our "pine forest" which is now the shop and service drive area and planted them at the corner along with a sign. The sign has changed over the years but each day when I come to work I look at the height of these trees and think of the ways I have grown in ministry and often think of Arden and his vision for so many things that have impacted the lives of thousands of people that have come to love this place. It is also a place that gives direction and we hope this happens in the lives of the many people that turn that corner.



One of the most positive aspects of my ministry over the past 38 years has been people. I have been so blessed by the many people that have become friends over this period of time. It will be the part I miss the most but will also be a huge part of the memories that I hold dear to me. People have ministered to me as I learn to know them and see how they grow and minister to others in this Sanctuary we call Camp Mack.

I will be sharing more about my experiences for the past 38 years in the next 9 months and I hope to see and talk with many of you as you are here for events, retreats and camps. I look forward, as I hope you do at the future of Camp Mack, as there are some exciting times ahead for the ministry here as we continue to be a shining light to the world. Please come be a part of this Sanctuary where people connect with God through Faith Formation, experiencing Creation and building Christian Community.

Full-time Food Service Manager

Camp Alexander Mack (Milford, IN) is seeking a new Food Service Manager to **begin on or around February 1, 2017**. This is a full-time, year-round, salaried position based on an average of 40-45 hours per week with many hours during the summer season, less hours in the fall and spring, and more limited hours in the winter. From Memorial Day to Labor Day, we are primarily a summer camp for children, youth, and families. From Labor Day to Memorial Day, we are primarily a retreat and outdoor education facility with frequent weekend use and occasional midweek groups. Occasional banquet and catering is also required. The Food Service Manager is responsible to plan, coordinate, and carry out food service for all scheduled groups, activities, and events throughout the year. Candidates should have training, education, and/or experience in food service management, culinary arts, quantity food service, and staff supervision. Candidate must be ServSafe Manager certified before beginning employment. The salary is based on experience and within the context of our non-profit environment. Benefits include insurance support, pension, and professional growth. Applications are due by December 15, 2016 or until the position has been filled.
