News from the Director

As February begins, the planning and work for our summer camping program is in full swing. Brochures have been mailed, camp representatives have met, church packets have been distributed, summer staff is being interviewed and hired. At the beginning of March, we have our team leader meeting. It is exciting to envision the life-changing experiences that will occur at camp this summer.

We are also looking for ways to expand our ministry beyond our current summer camping program and retreat offerings. At this time we are working on two new ways to increase our impact and connect people with God.

First, we are challenging every congregation to sponsor two children, who are not currently connected, to come to camp this summer. Each of these children should be children who are either associated with your church but not strongly connected, or children who are in the community of the church but not connected with a church family. What the church does is to identify the campers; make arrangements to get them to camp, including getting camperships and providing for the rest of their camp fees; and, designate the camper as a community camper on the registration form. What we will do then is contact the church pastor to find out who this person is and what connection they may have with the church. After camp, we will contact whomever the pastor has asked us to contact to share back some of the camp experiences of the camper, so that the church can work on building relationship from there. It is our hope that we can help the congregation make these connections stronger over time. If the congregation wishes to sponsor more than two children, that would be terrific, we will work with whatever number of campers sent, but for now we are only challenging each church to sponsor two.

Another exciting ministry will take longer to implement, but we hope it will have a big impact. In the summer of 2018, we plan to run a pilot camp for children with behavioral and/or emotional disabilities. This would be a small camp to make certain we are prepared for the unique challenges these children will bring. If all goes well, we would create a full camp program beginning in the summer of 2019. Planning for this starts now, so we are looking for people who have professional experience with behavioral and emotional disabilities to help us begin the process. If you would like to assist in the planning process, please contact me by calling the camp office or emailing me at gene@campmack.org. This is an important opportunity for us to meet a real need in our communities.

God calls us to be light and salt in the world, and we will continue to explore ways that our ministry and yours can work together to make it be so.

Sunny Camp Mack

I thought I would take a little time to talk about our work in our buildings in the winter here at Camp. This fall we completed a remodel on the upstairs women's restroom in Ulrich. We had a small water leak this summer behind one of the john's. By the time we discovered the problem it had done some damage to the flooring. Therefore, we pulled out the stall dividers and pulled up the john's and replaced the flooring. At the same time we replaced the exhaust fans with some new ones with L.E.D. lights in them. This makes a big difference in the amount of light in the shower stalls. We finished with some painting and that restroom looks a lot better. Our restrooms take a beating in the course of a summer. Over a ten week summer of camps each shower stall can be used 400-500 times. We experience quite a bit of iron in our water so we need to clean and replace shower heads regularly. We have the same issues with sinks. Faucets and drains need to be regularly cleaned and replaced. A slow draining sink can be pretty disgusting.

We have also been replacing some older florescent light with some of the new L.E.D. lights. The savings in energy and the increased quality of light is wonderful. I think our scrapbookers and quilters will appreciate the better light.

Of course at this time of the year we do a lot of painting. We go into each building and find the scrapes and nicks from the summer and put some stain and polyurethane or paint on them. This really helps the looks of our buildings. We are doing a little experimenting this winter on some of our old tables. We salvaged 20 of our MityLite tables from Becker after the fire. We have used them in the auditorium the past six years and they were showing some serious wear. We found a primer and a paint that seems to stick to our tables so we are bringing them into our shop and painting them. They sure look better and we hope the paint will not nick and scratch too quickly. Our volunteers continue to build benches and desks and stain and poly them also.

We hope to complete one more remodel in the upstairs women's restroom of SM before spring. All of this is a part of creating the "..Sanctuary where people connect with God."
