TEAM BUILDING



Camp's qualified instructors will lead your group through a variety of team building events to increase your group's effectiveness. In addition to high-interest, low impact activities, we offer: a challenge course with fixed elements; a 32-foot climbing tower with multiple levels of difficulty; a 350-foot zip line from the top of our climbing tower; a new multi-level high ropes course; and a flying squirrel.

SWIMMING & BOATING

Certified lifeguards supervise all waterfront activities, including: sailing, canoeing, kayaking, row-boating, and swimming. Swimming is available Memorial Day through Labor Day, and boating is available May through mid-October.

OUTDOOR EDUCATION

We offer more than 30 field study options tied to state standards that include optional pre- and post-lessons for back in the classroom. Field studies include adventure, environmental science, and outdoor skills options. We offer day and overnight programs custom-built to your school's learning objectives. Fall

and spring sessions are available. Call or email for details.

DINING FACILITIES

The Kate Warstler Dining Center, located in the John Kline Welcome Center, has dining for up to 300 guests with flexible rooms to accommodate various group sizes. Dining Room A alone has space for 180. Dining Rooms B and C each have a capacity of 60 people. Call for catered event details.

MEETING AREAS

The Turkey Creek Meeting Room is a fully equipped conference room in the John Kline Welcome Center. Additional three-season meeting spaces include: Shultz Chapel—a quiet lakeside spot for worship, meditation, and special gatherings accommodating up to 75; and Quinter Miller Auditorium for larger groups and special events of up to 800 guests. Retreat & Rental Accommodations

JOHN KLINE WELCOME CENTER

This building houses the Manly Deeter Office Center and the Kate Warstler Dining Center. As you enter the main entrance, a spacious lobby greets you with a fireplace, seating area, and library. Just off the lobby are restrooms, the Gift Shoppe, and the Turkey Creek Meeting Room. The large dining room can be divided to accommodate three groups. Serving options include buffet line, family style, or banquet style. Dining capacity: 300.



SARAH MAJOR LODGE

As multi-level lakeside lodging, Sarah Major Lodge includes: a spacious lounge/meeting room with views of the lake on the main floor with a wood-burning fireplace and kitchenette; recreation/meeting area and kitchen located on the lower level; three bedrooms on the main level and five bedrooms on the upper level; and centrally located restrooms and showers. Overnight capacity: 60–65 summer setup/48–54 most of retreat season.

ULRICH HOUSE

Ulrich House is a multi-level retreat lodge and includes: a main floor lounge with kitchen and a wood-burning fireplace; recreation/meeting area located on the lower level; 15 total bedrooms on the main and upper levels; and restrooms on the main and upper levels. Overnight capacity: 39 summer/53 most of retreat season.



WAMPLER LODGE

This lakeside retreat lodge includes: a spacious lounge/meeting area with kitchen and wood-burning fireplace; four carpeted bedrooms; centrally located restrooms and showers; and a wood deck with a view of the lake. Overnight capacity: 22.

MISSION VILLAGE YURTS

The Mission Village wooden yurts are three-season retreat lodging that include: a central meeting yurt that can accommodate up to 48 people; five yurts connected by a central boardwalk. Four yurts have ten beds, and one has three to six beds. Heated restrooms with showers are connected by boardwalk. Overnight sleeping capacity: 43–46.



SEASONAL CABINS

Six three-season cabins include accommodations for up to 60 guests (W-cabins). These have heating capabilities and twin beds, not bunks. There are sixteen cabins available from May–September (E-cabins and Letter cabins). Two of the Letter cabins have single twin beds; the rest have twin bunk beds. These cabins accommodate up to 157 guests total. Each area has a centrally-located bathhouse (restrooms and showers) and a nearby campfire circle.

MOTHER DAUGHTER RETREAT, "PLACE IN THIS WORLD"

Fee: \$52 per child ages 5–8, \$90 per person age 9 through adult. Includes lodging and meals.

GRAND CAMP

Spend quality time bonding with your grandkids and making memories that will last a lifetime. This camp will provide a time for grandparents to make connections with their grandchildren through a variety of activities, such as swimming, boating, hiking, games, campfires, crafts, storytimes, Bible studies, and maybe even a nap! Due to supervision limitations, we ask that you bring no more than three grandchildren to this event.

Age: Grandparents of all ages and grandchildren ages 5–10

Fee: \$160 per grandparent and \$110 per grandchild.

Dates: June 10–12, August 1–3



COLONY FAMILY CAMP

Fun and fellowship for the whole family! Colony Camp is a great opportunity to experience some summer fun with your family before everyone heads back to school. Enjoy the planned group activities along with boating and swimming, or simply relax and spend quality time with family and friends. Bring your RV, tent, or use one of the cabins. Bring your own food and bedding, and enjoy a weekend at Camp Mack!

Age: Families of all ages. Anyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.

Fee: \$92 per family. Camp lodging, if needed, is extra. No meals are provided by camp.

Date: August 13–15, 6p Friday to 1p Sunday.

LABOR DAY FAMILY CAMP

This popular camp offers something for the entire family! Swimming, boating, crafts, and community worship are available, along with age-appropriate classes and discussion groups.

Age: Families of all ages. Anyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.

Fee: \$90 per family (\$100 after 7/14) with options for shortened stays. Additional fee for lodging and meals.

FATHER SON RETREAT, "GO!"

QUILT RETREAT

This is a unique opportunity for quilters of all ages to gather and share their expertise and love of quilting while enjoying the tranquil scenery of Camp Mack. Bring your sewing machine, UFOs (unfinished objects), and quilting supplies. All levels of quilters, from novice to expert, are invited! Due to facility limitations and distancing recommendations, space is especially limited.

Fee: \$140 per quilter arriving Friday evening, \$150 per quilter arriving on Friday morning, \$186 per quilter arriving on Thursday evening, \$211 per quilter arriving on Wednesday evening (April and October). Fee includes housing and scheduled meals.

Dates: February 18–21, April 14–18, October 13–17, 6p Thursday (early arrival for April/October is Wednesday 6p) to 3p Sunday.

SCRAPBOOKING RETREAT

Crop 'til you drop with a weekend of scrap therapy. Bring the scrapbook you need to finish or may have been waiting for the perfect time to begin. Spread out your supplies and enjoy an uninterrupted time with fellow scrappers. Bring your extra scraps, paper, stickers and more to trade and swap at the swap table.

Fee: \$134 per scrapper arriving Friday evening, \$148 per scrapper arriving on Friday morning, \$168 per scrapper arriving on Thursday evening. Fee includes housing and scheduled meals.

Dates: February 25–28 and October 14–17, 6p Thursday (early arrival) to 3p Sunday.

SEASONED CITIZENS RETREAT

Join this group of life-experienced people who gather twice a year to meet old friends and make new ones. ANNUAL DINNER





Camp Mack 2021 COVID-19 Updates

There is a lot we do not know about how COVID-19 will continue to affect Camp Mack programs and rentals. Vaccines give us hope that restrictions will begin to lessen. Camp Mack has COVID-19 protocols that follow federal, state, and local guidelines. These are monitored weekly and changes are made as new guidelines are released. These guidelines apply to all summer camps, rentals, and retreats.

Summer Camps

Plans are in progress for a safe and welcoming summer camp experience for children and youth. There are several safety measures we will have in place, likely for this summer only. They include:

- Hired summer counselors to limit outside exposure
- Activities scheduled in small groups who will remain together for most of camp
- Adjustments to community activities, such as campfires and worship, that honor the purpose of the activities as well as safety recommendations
- Emphasis on outdoor activities
- Changes to mealtime routines
- Mask usage for staff and campers in indoor spaces and when in close contact

Additionally, there will be guidelines for campers that will include recommendations for what to do before coming to camp, as well as a screening process used during registration.

Families, Rentals, and Retreats

If you are considering bringing your family or a group to Camp Mack, you are welcome to see Camp's protocols and discuss plans with us. Contact Deanna (deanna@campmack.org), Camp's Guest Services Director, if you would like to explore this further.

There is no place that can guarantee complete safety until most of the population is vaccinated. So, for unvaccinated people who are highly vulnerable, the safest thing to do is to stay away from groups and gatherings. For others, Camp Mack would not offer programs or rental spaces if we did not believe we have created as safe a space as possible.

NEW REGISTRATION DETAILS FOR 2021

Registration will open February 15th, 2021. In the event that Camp Mack cancels camp, registered campers will receive a package of camp activities in place of a refunded deposit.

DEPOSITS

To be fully registered for a camp, a non-refundable deposit of \$75 must be received. If a deposit is not received, your spot for the camp is not reserved. Full payment is expected by June 1st.

REFUND POLICY

Any cancellations received 30 days prior to your camp start date will receive a full refund minus the \$75 deposit. Cancellations received less than 30 days prior to your camp start date will receive a refund of ½ of the registration minus the \$75 deposit. If a child does not arrive for camp, all registration fees are forfeited.

PAYMENT PLANS AND CAMPERSHIPS

Camp Mack offers a number of ways to help cover the cost of camp. Payment Plans breakdown the cost of camp into automatic monthly payments for up to a six month period. Camperships (camp scholarships) for up to half of the early registration fee are available through the camp for families needing financial assistance. 
