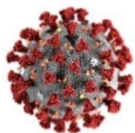

Camp Mack 2021 COVID-19 Updates

There is a lot we do not know about how COVID-19 will continue to affect Camp Mack programs and rentals. Vaccines give us hope that restrictions will begin to lessen. Camp Mack has COVID-19 protocols that follow federal, state, and local guidelines. These are monitored weekly and changes are made as new guidelines are released. These guidelines apply to all summer camps, rentals, and retreats.

SUMMER CAMPS

Plans are in progress for a safe and welcoming summer camp experience for children and youth. There are several safety measures we will have in place, likely for this summer only. They include:

- Hired summer counselor to limit outside exposure
- Activities scheduled in small groups who will remain together for most of camp
- Adjustments to community activities, such as campfires and worship, that honor the purpose of the activities as well as safety recommendations
- Emphasis on outdoor activities
- Changes to mealtime routines
- Mask usage for staff and campers in indoor spaces andn when in close contact

Additionally, there will be guidelines for campers that will include recommendations for what to do before coming to camp, as well as a screening process used during registration

FAMILIES, RENTALS, and RETREATS

If you are considering bringing your family or a group to Camp Mack, you are welcome to see Camp's protocols and discuss plans with us. Contact Deanna (deanna@campmack.org), Camp's Guest Services Director, if you would like to explore this further.

There is no place that can guarantee complete safety until most of the population is vaccinated. So, for unvaccinated people who are highly vulnerable, the safest thing to do is to stay away from groups and gatherings. For others, Camp Mack would not offer programs or rental spaces if we did not believe we have created as safe a space as possible.

Summer Program Highlights

Beginners, Samplers, Seekers, Finders, Followers, and Youth Camp are our traditional summer camps with Bible studies, swimming, boating, campfires, and age-appropriate activities.

Archery Camp is a camp to learn the sport of target shooting. Campers will learn proficiency through fun and exciting archery games.

Creative Arts Camp is full of time to explore visual arts, musical arts, speech, and drama, as well as enjoy regular camp activities. Camp ends with a camper-led worship service that campers write and lead. **Creative Arts will return in 2022.*

Culinary Camp explores many different aspects of creating and preparing delicious meals. The week commences Friday evening with a scrumptious dinner prepared by campers for the campers' immediate families. Bon Appétit!

Survivor Camp will team with Camp Brethren Heights. Under the leadership of Randall Westfall, campers learn all sorts of great skills as they connect with creation, their community, and their Creator while working in a tribal setting. Rediscover an untamed faith that is on fire for God! **Dadirri, an Advanced Survivor camp will return in 2022.*

Splash Camp is an experience in all things water. Kayaking, sailing, fishing, snorkeling, a seafood boil, water testing, and more are all part of this waterific week.

Eco Adventure takes places in the group camping area in the wilderness area at camp. Tent camping, making meals over the fire, making a pit turkey, and typical camp activities are part of this week. Campers will return to main camp for swimming, boating, and showers. **Eco Adventure will return in 2022.*

SUMMER CURRICULUM

Creation Speaks

“God saw all that he had made, and it was very good.”

Genesis 1:31a

Our Bible study theme for 2021 is *Creation Speaks*. Camp is an intentional community where campers connect with new friends, great leadership, nature, and most of all, with Christ. This year’s theme explores how God has been speaking since the beginning of time and we hear His word through the scriptures and the stories written in nature. Jesus often used elements from creation in His teaching. What will Creation teach us this summer?

Daily Bible Study Themes:

Day 1: Invited by Light

Genesis 1:1-5 and John 8:12

Day 2: Refreshed by Water

Genesis 1:6-8 and John 4:4-15

Day 3: Shaped Like Earth

Genesis 1:9-13 and Jeremiah 18:1-10

Day 4: Moving through Seasons

Genesis 1:14-19 and Ecclesiastes 3:1-11

Day 5: Kinship with Animals

Genesis 1:20-25 and Genesis 8:1-12

Day 6: Purpose for Humanity

Genesis 1:26-31 and Genesis 2:4-7

Day 7: Inspired by Creation

Genesis 2:1-3 and Psalm 104:1-13, 24, 31

Camp is a great place to experience God, community, and nature. Camp teaches the importance of living in community, allows for time with God each day, and provides a place to power down while being surrounded by the serenity of nature. Campers will know that God is with them wherever they go and will be given the chance to grow in their relationship with Christ and learning how to faithfully live out their lives.



CAMPER REGISTRATION (info for camp reps)

CHURCH TRANSFER CODE/GOLD SHEET INFORMATION

Church Transfer Codes are the new way of churches covering camper registration fees. This method takes all camper fees the church is paying and transfers them to the church's account. This system makes registration easier for both camp reps and families.

1. Talk with your church leadership about how much of a camper's fees your church will cover.
2. Complete the gold sheet either online at campmack.org/camp-rep or the paper copy in your camp rep packet and return it to Camp.
3. Camp will contact you with your transfer code(s)
4. Share your transfer code for your church with your campers.
5. Check the online church portal to make sure your campers registered
6. Receive an invoice listing all of your campers on March 30th
7. Send a payment for your church's balance to Camp Mack.

CHURCH TRANSFER CODE FAQ

Can I get multiple transfer codes if my church covers different amounts for different campers?

Yes, you can have up to three different transfer codes

Do I need to fill out a blue sheet?

No, the gold sheet has replaced the blue sheet.

We pay a flat rate, can we set up a transfer code for a flat rate?

Yes, transfer codes can be a flat rate or a percentage

Should we send all of our paper registrations in at once?

No, have campers send in their registration as soon as possible

CAMPERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Camp Mack provides camperships to campers to help reduce the financial impact of summer camp on families.

Camperships are offered for up to 1/2 of the camp fee. (Many local churches pay a portion of their campers' fees.) Camper families who may be needing support need to follow the application process below.

TO APPLY:

1. Ask your pastor or other adult leader to write a letter to Camp Mack explaining the need for a campership.
2. Letters should be mailed or email to the Camp Mack office.



These campership funds are generated from an endowment funds from many donors

Registering Campers

A \$75 deposit is required to be registered for camp and to guarantee a spot in your chosen camp.

Online Registration

Go to our website, www.campmack.org, and click on the **Register Online** button at the top of the page. Once the page opens, you will create a username and password. You can then login and register. Do not create a new account if you have registered online before; use the “forgot username” link.

REQUIRED MEDICAL INFORMATION

As an accredited camp of the American Camp Association (ACA), we must have on file detailed medical history on each camper. The summer registration form requests some information on food allergies and other special camper concerns to assist us in our planning. It is to be filled out and signed by the parent or guardian as part of registration.

Complete all required forms.

CANCELLATIONS, TRANSFERS, NO SHOWS, AND REFUNDS

CANCELLATIONS:

Call the Camp Mack Office at 574-658-4831 or email Camp Mack at info@campmack.org

- a. Notify us more than **30 days prior** to the camp, and we will refund the **registration fee less the \$75.00 deposit.**
- b. Notify us **less than 30 days** before the camp begins, and we will **refund 1/2 the registration fee less the \$75.00 deposit.**

NO SHOWS

If a child does not show up for the week, he/she is registered for reasons other than health or family emergency, **all registration fees are forfeited.**

TRANSFERS

If it is necessary for a child to transfer to a different camp, any payments will be transferred to the new camp.

REFUNDS

All refunds will be sent to the person or church who made the payment **after September 10**
No refund check will be issued for less than \$10.00.

2021 Specific

If Camp Mack cancels camp, registered campers will receive a package of camp activities in place of a refunded deposit.

LEADERSHIP QUALIFICATIONS

2021 SPECIFICS

Team Leaders: We need Team leaders for all camps. Counselors will receive two weeks of training prior to counseling and the schedule will be made for you this year.

Counselors: We are hiring 14 counselors that will cover all summer camps apart from Survivor and Youth camps. These counselors will need to be 21 years or older as they will be working with all ages. It will be a six-week season that includes two weeks of training.

CIT's (Counselors in Training): We will be offering a CIT camp this summer to continue growing leadership and preparing for summers to come.

2022 onward: We will return to using primarily volunteer counselors and hire some that would work every week.

Camp Mack is always looking for qualified leadership to facilitate our summer programs. This is one of our prime needs.

**We request churches supply 1 counselor for every 6 campers they send to camp.*

Think about the people in your congregation. **Who would you want to have your child or grandchild spend a week with at camp?**

- Take time to talk to that person individually.
- Share your confidence in them and encourage them to consider being a counselor at Camp Mack.
- Give them time to think and pray about it.
- If they decide to counsel, give them a volunteer application to complete and return to the camp.
- Check back with them in a week or so and ask them if they have completed the application.
- If they have questions, try to answer them, or refer them to Jessie Kreider (jessk@campmack.org).

Some people may think they are too old. However, our average counselor age is over 30 and many successful counselors are over 70.

Age Requirements for Counselors:

Beginners (Grade 1):	18 years or older, completed High School
Samplers (Grade 2-3):	18 years or older, completed High School
Seekers (Grade 3-4):	18 years or older, completed High School
Finders (Grade 5-6):	18 years or older, completed High School
Followers (Grade 7-9):	21 years or older
Youth (Grade 9-12):	25 years or older, invited by YCC

While age is significant in determining readiness for counseling at Camp Mack, perhaps more significant is the example of Christian values demonstrated by the person who is counseling. Exceptions to age guidelines need prior approval from our Program Director, Jessie Kreider.

CONSELOR-IN-TRAINING PROGRAM and FLYE Weekends

Do you know a youth with potential leadership ability who is committed to Christ and Christian living? Do you know a youth who has grown up loving camp or may want to counsel? Our **Counselor-In-Training** program is designed to encourage youth **14–17 years old** to explore and grow into the counseling role.



Counselors-In-Training will wear many hats as they work with a lead counselor to provide leadership. To help ready them for their CIT experience, please encourage them to attend **the Leadership Training Weekend (returning in 2022)**. The training begins at 7 p.m. on Friday evening and concludes at 4 p.m. on Saturday. Anyone who is interested in being a CIT is invited to attend this training, even if they are not sure they can return in the summer to help in a CIT role.

While age is significant in determining readiness for CIT's at Camp Mack, the Christian values they demonstrate are more important. All age exceptions need to have prior approval from Jessie Kreider, Program Director.

CIT applications are available from the Camp Mack office or online at campmack.org under the Volunteering/Employment tab. Application and Pastor Reference forms are required.

CIT CAMP (NEW FOR 2021!) Campers ages 14-17 will grow in leadership while enjoying a typical summer camp. Service projects will be included each day as well as taking a deeper look into presenting Bible study themes to various age groups, doing craft as well as setting up the activities, and typical camp activities like swimming and boating.

FLYE Weekends (Fun Leadership Youth Events) are for youth ages 14–17 who are interested in training to be leaders through team building, service, and leadership. Youth will serve through participating in the Camp Mack Festival (October 1–2). Weekends also include training in different areas of leadership and experiential training through team building initiatives.

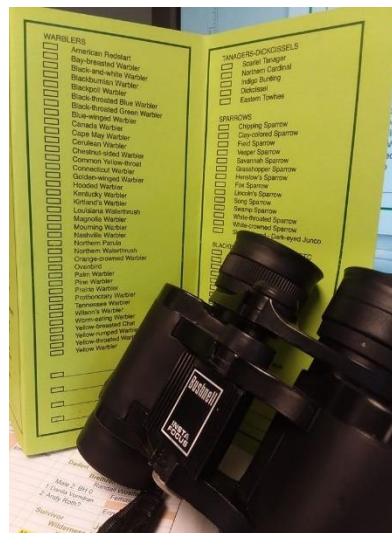

SUMMER VOLUNTEER NEEDS

Summer volunteers are an important part of our camping program. The following areas are some ways of serving during the summer, as well as through the rest of the year.

Camp Counselor: Counselors are responsible for a cabin of campers for 23 hours each day. A cabin of girls and a cabin of boys forms a family group. Working with your CIT (if you have one) and your family group, you will plan your daily activities for Bible Study and family time. You also help plan total group activities such as Morning Watch, Vespers, recreation, or campfires assigned to your family by your Team Leader.

REMINDER: *Your church is responsible to supply one male or female leader for every six children and youth you send to camp. This 1:6 ratio helps us provide the needed supervision for the safety and health concerns of our program.*

Food Service:

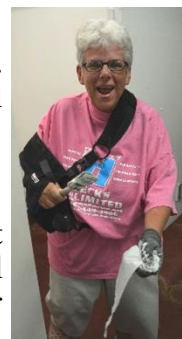
Help prepare and serve meals to the campers. This could involve the use of mixers, steamers, and other kitchen equipment. Come for the day and help bake cookies for the campers. Overnight housing may be available, and meals are provided.

Facilities:

Help around the buildings and grounds. Prepare and service the buildings for daily use. Work around the grounds on special projects. Let us know your skills, and we will match you with a job. Overnight housing may be available, and meals are provided.

Health Office:

We need a RN, PA, or MD to run the camp health office each week. Current certification in child/adult CPR/AED and first aid are required. Health personnel will distribute meds and take care of minor first aid and illnesses in accordance with our standing orders.



2021 VOLUNTEER UPDATES

Counselors- Counselors will be 100% hired in 2021 with volunteer counselors and some hired counselors returning in 2022. Encourage those who are age 21+ to apply for our 6-week hired counselor position.

Food Service and Facility- Please contact the camp office if you are interested in more information. Overnight housing may be available.

Health Office- We will be hiring a health officer for 2021 for a 5-week period. Health volunteers will be needed June 27 and July 4, 7, 11, 18, and 25 to assist with camper check ins to screen campers.

Publicity Helps and Hints

How can you best publicize what is happening at Camp Mack? Here are a few easy ways:

Word of mouth: Take time during morning worship to encourage your congregation to keep Camp Mack in their prayers. During announcement time, remind families about the registration deadlines for upcoming events. Ask to speak to the Sunday School classes about camp. Talk to potential campers in person or give them a phone call.

Promotional Video: Play the video from YouTube (or DVD) before worship and/or in Sunday School. Invite your congregation to a special evening of learning about Camp Mack's summer programs by showing the video and inviting a Camp Mack staff person to share about summer camp.



The written word: Bulletins and church newsletters are great ways to pass on information about Camp Mack. Watch your email for newsletter articles entitled “Camp Mack Corner” for each month of the year. You will want to give these articles to your newsletter editor. The “Camp Mack Corner” will help you get out important information that persons in your congregation want to know. You will want to hang the posters that are in your packet in appropriate locations in your church. Also, feel free to print off the monthly Mackabilia newsletter and share with those who do not receive this email.

Invite camp staff to your church: We can provide pulpit supply, share about camp for a short period or for a Sunday hour. If you are doing a Camp Mack Sunday with campers sharing, invite us. We love to see what impact Camp Mack has made.

CREATIVE WAYS TO ENCOURAGE...

Here you will find ideas you can use to encourage the persons in your congregation to come share some time at Camp Mack. There are many positive and creative ideas that have been shared with us through the years. Here are a few that you may want to try.

1. Personal sharing is great because the enthusiasm is contagious. Have an **ice cream social or church picnic** and let campers, volunteers, or older adults who have attended camp share their experiences at Camp Mack.
2. Talk to your church leadership and your Pastor. Ask them to explore the possibility of having **worship or a church picnic at Camp Mack**. It's a great way to get people to Camp Mack who have never been there and reconnect those where it has been a while.
3. Churches that **pay a portion of camper fees** encourage families to explore sending their children to camp. A fund that assists families financially could be used for our children's program, our family camp opportunities, or even our Seasoned Citizens' retreats. Money to support this fund could come from a number of different sources – such as the Women's fellowship/Men's fellowship or as a part of the church budget.
4. Have your campers **write a letter of thanks** to the church for the financial support they receive. Encourage them to share their excitement about their week at camp.
5. Use a children's time to **share what camp meant** to you and ask others to share meaningful experiences they had while at camp.
6. Take the time during Sunday School to **sing some camp songs**. Help the children learn some of the songs they will be singing around the campfire.
7. Encourage your congregation, not only parents, to **write or email campers** while at camp. We can see the excitement on the campers' faces when they receive mail.

****A great way to assure campers mail comes on time is to drop the mail off at the camp office and write on the envelope in the stamp spot which day of camp you would like the letter delivered. We would be happy to sort and deliver for you.***
8. **Publish the names** of your campers and volunteers weekly in your bulletin. This will allow persons in the congregation to keep them on their prayer lists throughout the week.
9. Bring a group of possible campers & their families to **tour the camp**. Call ahead and our staff would be happy to give you a tour and answer your questions
10. As you get ready to publicize an event (i.e. Father/Son Retreat), encourage a former participant to **share their experience** with the congregation.
