The grant specifically funds an after-school program, school break day camps, and related expenses.

While these new grant-supported programs will indirectly help the core operations of Camp Mack, they will not make up for the decrease in summer registrations over the past three years. Additionally, the grant does not provide any assistance to ongoing maintenance or construction projects.
