Bringing the Godspell of Peace

"You, child, will be called a prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way. You will tell his people how to be saved through the forgiveness of their sins. Because of our God's deep compassion, the dawn from heaven will break upon us, to give light to those who are sitting in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide us on the path of peace." -Luke 1:76-79 (CEB)

Too often we forget that John the Baptist is part of the Christmas story, too. When Mary learned of her pregnancy, she visited her relative, Elizabeth, who was expecting her first-born son. The most recognized verses from Luke 1 are what we often call "The Magnificat," Mary's proclamation of her child who would free the oppressed and bring relief to the poor. Shortly after Mary returns to Nazareth, Elizabeth gives birth to John. His father, Zechariah proclaims that this birth shall also be a sign of God's love and care. John's ministry will be one of calling people to repentance as they prepare for the one who will come later. Zechariah's proclamation is one that also fits the ministry of Camp Mack. As John the Baptist begins his lonely song, "Prepare ye the way of the Lord," others join in, and the unaccompanied voice becomes a chorus backed with joyful instruments.

We invite you to become part of the Jesus story as it unfolds here at Camp Mack. At times, you may be Elizabeth, Zechariah, and John, serving God by preparing for the ministry yet to come. Other times, you may be Mary or Jesus, ministering to people who need comfort, words of encouragement, or the Good News. And always, you have the opportunity to enter this sanctuary for the purpose of connecting with God and living in the Christian community surrounded by the beauty of creation. Blessings as you anticipate and experience the wonder of Christmas this season. May you find sanctuary in the Gospel (*Godspell*) of Jesus.

The Impact of Camp Staff

October was my seven year work 'anniversary'. I really can't believe that it has been seven years since I came back to Indiana and started working at camp full time. There are so many great people I have met, so many life lessons learned, and so many new skills gained in the last seven years. I can't wait to see what the next seven hold!!

As we are in the thick of the Holiday season, sending Christmas cards, purchasing and wrapping presents, baking holiday treats, and planning family gatherings, I am thinking about all the summer staff who have impacted my life, and who have touched many lives with their seasonal work at camp. Each has left their mark here in some way. Keeping the campers safe while participating in waterfront activities. Cheering everyone on at the ropes course. Making sure there are eating utensils in the sack lunches for the offsite trip. Cutting down weeds and trimming bushes along the paths and trails. Sharing ideas and inspiration with their directors and supervisors. Singing songs and playing instruments at campfires. Even though it's the middle of December and there is snow on the ground (hopefully), the full-time camp staff are thinking and praying about summer camp. We are praying that God will provide the right staff for us as we continue to create this sanctuary space for everyone to be able to connect with Him. So if you, or someone you know, are looking for the most amazing, impactful, life-changing summer job, you should really think about applying to work at camp this summer.

Here is the amazing, simple Alfredo sauce recipe (to the left). It's perfect over your favorite pasta when you need a warm hearty meal on a cold day. And, it freezes well, so if you make a bigger batch, you can freeze the sauce and reheat it later. I love that this recipe is so easy to adjust to your personal preferences, just add more or less seasonings until it tastes the way you want it to. I usually add more garlic when I make it at home! <u>Alfredo Sauce</u>

1 cup butter 16 oz. cream cheese 2-3 cups half and half ³/₄ cup parmesan cheese 1/8 cup garlic powder Pepper, to taste 2 teaspoons parsley, 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning

Melt butter in a large stock pot on medium low heat. Cube cream cheese and whisk into melted butter. Continue whisking until incorporated. Add half and half, stirring vigorously to thin out the cheese mixture. Add Parmesan

Add Parmesan cheese and seasonings. Continue stirring until the cheese has mostly melted, and the sauce is warm. Pour over warm pasta or serve alongside buttered noodles.

Fall of 2023

Fall always brings a feeling that it is time to store away. That probably comes from my farm background, but it is certainly a feeling that is meaningful here at Camp. We had an early cold snap, and that just heightened those feelings. Cory and I have been blessed with several volunteer groups to help us to put things away. We have 130 or so benches to store in Quinter Miller Auditorium each fall, and the Everence marking group helped us to put those inside.

The Shoue family comes each fall, and this year they cut down several dead trees and cut them up for firewood. They also replaced another section of the boardwalk in Mission Village. That boardwalk was built in 2003, and we have been replacing sections of it the past three years. We are probably 65–70% done with it.

Outside restrooms are always an issue. I trained Cory last year, and he is pretty good at getting all the water out of the lines. Any water left in a line can cause some headaches next spring. There is also a little bit of winterizing on some of our retreat buildings to keep things warm for the winter. As I sit here the first week of December, Cory and I are going over our lists to make sure we have not forgotten anything.

Another big event in the life of Camp retreat buildings happened this fall. Alliance Comfort Solutions of Warsaw installed a furnace and an air conditioner in Wampler. The old boiler had served well since the mid-eighties, and now we have air-conditioned comfort for those hot old summer days.

For this winter, we are preparing the lower program room of Ulrich for a new floor. Ultimate Edge of Millersburg is going to install an epoxy flake floor surface for us. They first go in and renovate the chipped-up surface of the cement and then put down the new floor. That is really going to change the looks of that space.

We are really grateful for all the volunteer help we had this fall as we continue to improve this "...sanctuary where people connect with God."
