
PROMISE

Just as the community of disciples and followers received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we hope all our community **will receive the promise of God's love with great joy**, inspiring them to share that promise through the ministry of Camp Mack.

FROM THE INDIANA CAMP BOARD CHAIR

At a recent Christian Camp and Conference Association webinar, I heard this definition of a board: "The Board is a spiritual community called by God to steward a piece of God's kingdom work here on earth." I am grateful to be given an opportunity to serve at Camp Mack in this way. It is truly a place doing God's kingdom work, providing a peaceful sanctuary where all persons are welcomed to connect with God and one another in the beauty of creation.

The Indiana Camp Board benefits greatly from the deep commitment and experience of past and current members. In the past year, we captured some of this working knowledge through a deliberate review of the orientation, education, and policies of board members. We helped adjust the budget to make sure spending does not exceed revenue, and we supported the excellent work of the staff to adopt the Discrimination and Harassment Statement. As a board, we continue to balance the tasks of looking inward and outward, weighing the needs of increasingly diverse constituents with evaluating the changes necessary to minister to others in our communities and beyond. Radio ads continue to connect us to more people. The outdoor education programming, after some setbacks, is filling a need in both the public schools and the homeschool community. A review of the demographics of our constituents revealed that 82% of our campers and guests are partners who rent our facilities and some programs. Additionally, it is estimated that 80% of campers and guests are not members of the Church of the Brethren.

I am filled with gratitude for the myriad ways people give to Camp Mack. People give time in the kitchen, in the office, on the grounds in buildings or maintenance. I'll bet you can name even more. If you haven't had a chance to visit or volunteer lately, there are **always new ways to experience the sanctuary at Camp Mack**. With so many things happening, **you may be asked to give** some extra time serving in leadership, on a committee, or in sharing your ideas or expertise for new projects. You may be asked to help organize an event for the 100th anniversary, help weed the peace garden, offer prayers for a friend in need, or participate in some boisterous singing around a campfire. Whatever way you experience the community at Camp Mack, if you're asking yourself if you have something to offer, the answer is, "YES! You do!".

Over spring break, our family had the opportunity to visit some historical sites significant to the Civil Rights movement in Birmingham and Montgomery, Alabama. Throughout, I was reminded how the way of faithful non-violence (often met with violent opposition) was instrumental in showing the world a better way. I believe the way of peace is needed just as much now as it was then, and Camp Mack is poised to provide for that need, by offering that peace to all who visit.

PLANTING THE FUTURE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The *Planting the Future* capital campaign began in 2019 with the goal of raising 1.1 million dollars to establish a strong foundation for the future through strategic planning, the development of an outdoor education program, and modernization of our facilities.

Strategic planning and outdoor education have become core elements of the Camp Mack program. By the end of 2021, funds had been used to build the Esther and John Hamer Health Center and the Peace Garden, a favorite stop for many of our guests.

In August of 2022, we celebrated nearing the end with a barbeque meal on the Ulrich House patio. The final goal was reached three months later.

In the fall of 2022, volunteers, under the leadership of volunteer construction manager Steve Keim, began the transformation of Ulrich House into a comfortable and accessible adult retreat center. Early in 2023, Mike Kauffman and Curt Rowland supervised the final touches, turning Ulrich House into Ulrich Lodge.

All told, the project gave the interior a facelift, completed ADA restrooms, built an elevator for additional accessibility, updated heating with added air conditioning, installed a new roof, and provided new furnishings including the elimination of all bunk beds. This beautiful, modernized building maintains the charm of Camp Mack while serving adults comfortably. The building was dedicated on August 20, 2023.

Remaining funds are being used for signage, design consultants for the master facility plan, and a contribution to the Sarah Major carpet fund.

We thank all who participated in this milestone capital campaign that will truly impact the sanctuary experience for generations of campers and guests.


