



Who will eat the pumpkins? A Trail Cam Mystery

During a rainy Monday afternoon, afterschool campers designed, cleaned, and carved pumpkins. For many, it was their first time ever carving a pumpkin.

They didn't take their pumpkins home, but instead we piled them in the wilderness area at camp and put out a trail cam to see who would visit.

Over the last few weeks, we have seen dozens of deer, a family of raccoons, numerous turkeys, foxes, two coyotes, a cat, and even a few squirrels nibbling on the pumpkins.

It has been enjoyable to use a trail cam to get a glimpse into the diversity of the wildlife at camp. Earlier this year we even saw an otter family, mink, great blue herons, muskrat, and more at the beaver dam under the bridge.

Trail cams aren't the only way we discover the mysteries of camp. Our campers get lessons in reading tracks and looking for other signs such as scat, feathers, and fur. How will you discover the wonders around you?

Pancake Art

Pancake art is a favorite indoor activity among our campers. Make some at home for delicious edible art.

Supplies:

Electric Griddle, spatula, squeeze bottle, table knife

Ingredients:

Pancake Mix (I prefer the Krusteaz brand where you just add water but we also made pancakes with a gluten free mix and added more liquids), food colors (I used gels), pancake syrup, water

Instructions:

- 1. Prepare the pancake batter. We did not follow any specific measurements, but added enough liquid to make the batter the consistency of melted ice cream (or just a bit thicker). Use a hand mixer to get it super smooth.
- 2. Add pancake batter to squeeze bottles. Add a few drops of food coloring to the batter and stir with a table knife.
- 3. Preheat griddle temperature to 200 F degrees for 15 minutes. Lightly oil the surface
- 4. With the bottle tip close to the griddle, start with the outline of your picture and then add other layers. These layers can overlap previous layers. We loved adding a final outline to the picture to make it stand out more.
- 5. Once the picture is complete, turn the griddle up to 250 degrees F.
- 6. Forget everything you know about pancakes, and DO NOT flip the pancake when you see bubbles. Allow the pancake to turn from glossy to matte (loses all of its shininess). Now you may flip your pancake out onto a plate and admire your creation. (We used a spatula to loosen the pancake edges all the way around before making the flip.
- 7. Add syrup and enjoy. (For little hands, tearing the pancake into strips and dipping in a small cup of syrup worked well for snacking)
