Among the features of Camp Mack are our two wilderness areas. Primitive camping, high and low ropes courses, archery, the climbing wall, zip-line, a small prairie, and hiking trails create incredible opportunities for you to experience the sanctuary of Camp Mack. However, wilderness can also be found in periods of uncertainty and change, often leading to stress and fear as we look toward the unknown.



The Bible tells us the stories of Abraham, Moses, John the Baptist, and Jesus having incredible encounters with God when they entered the wilderness. This year's summer camp theme is In the Wilderness. Campers explore how we find God when we encounter change and experience the unknown. They learn about trusting God when trying new things and approaching new challenges.

The scripture focus for this year is Jeremiah 29:12-13 (NIV): "Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." This is part of God's promise to meet the people, in a period of change and uncertainty, and support them in finding their way.



CAMP MACK 2026 | Get-A-Way Days

EAGLE WATCH Prepare for an awesome eagle adventure as we travel to some well-known eagle locations near Mississinewa and Salamonie. Learn about their reintroduction and recovery efforts in Indiana and learn how to age an eagle that you see.

Ages: Birdwatchers of all ages.*

Fee: \$40, snacks/transportation included. Bring money for dinner on the drive home.

Packing List: Dress for the weather as we will be getting out of the van. Binoculars recommended.



SAILING 101 Learn how to rig a Sunfish and basic sailing techniques. Review helpful knots and safety tips. Then, head out on Lake Waubee for some practical experience on our fleet of Sunfish. Take out a Laser sailboat for a little more fun.

PRAIRIE RESTORATION WORK DAY We continue to work to restore our prairie and remove invasive brush within it. We will use loppers and chainsaws to remove and treat Autumn Olive and other brush. Work as a team to cut and pile brush.

We will travel to locations near Walkerton, to Kiwani Marsh, and finish at the Jasper-Pulaski Fish and Wildlife area where we will observe upwards of 10k–30k cranes in the field from the observation platform as they fly in and dance. Meet at the John Kline Welcome Center at Camp Mack before traveling offsite.

Fill your cookie jar for the holidays! Camp provides the ingredients, measuring utensils and mixing bowls. You bring the family (or not), mix the dough, sample cookies, and sip hot chocolate. Best of all, camp cleans up the mess! Choose 4 batches of cookies (each makes about 3 dozen).

Ages: 18 and older. All ages welcome as the guest of the registered participant.

Fee: \$55 per person, lunch and all baking materials included. Options to purchase additional cookie batches or lunches when registering.

Dates: December 5 or 6. Choose from Saturday morning (9 a.m.–1 p.m.), Saturday afternoon (Noon–4 p.m.), or Sunday afternoon session (Noon–4 p.m.).

HOMESCHOOL OUTDOOR EDUCATION DAYS Learning never was this fun! Camp Mack invites all homeschoolers to come out and enjoy the day at Camp. From September to April we meet once a month and explore a different theme each time. The majority of the classes are outdoors. Please dress for the weather.

QUILT RETREATS This is a unique opportunity for quilters of all ages to gather and share their expertise and love of quilting while enjoying the tranquil scenery of Camp Mack. All levels of quilters, from novice to expert, are invited! Due to facility limitations and distancing preferences, space is limited to the first 24 fully-paid quilters.

What to bring? Sewing supplies and projects, sewing machine, table light, show and tell items, bedding for a twin bed, towel, toiletries, etc.

What's provided? 6-to 8-foot table and accessible power strip access, shared cutting tables and irons with ironing boards, devotions, optional guided project (April and October).

Registration for Summer Camps and Grand Camps will open Sunday, February 1st, 2026 at 7 p.m.

Event Registration (not including summer camps)

Each event has a non-refundable deposit listed in the online registration page for the event. If the participant does not arrive for the event, all registration fees are forfeited. Adults are required to accompany minors for events that are not specifically for children/youth.

Summer Camp Deposits and Refund Policy

A non-refundable deposit of \$75 is required to be registered for a summer camp. Full payment is expected by June 1st. Any cancellations received 30 days prior to your camp start date will receive a full refund minus the \$75 deposit. Cancellations received less than 30 days prior to your camp start date will receive a refund of ½ of the registration minus the \$75 deposit. If a child does not arrive for camp, all registration fees are forfeited.

Financial Assistance for Summer Camps

JOHN KLINE WELCOME CENTER This building houses the Manly Deeter Office Center and the Kate Warstler Dining Center. As you enter the main entrance, a spacious gathering area greets you with a fireplace, comfy chairs, a fish tank, pianos, and a library. Just off the gathering area are restrooms, the Gift Shoppe, and the John Kline Meeting Room. The large dining room can be divided to accommodate three groups. Serving options include buffet, family-style, or banquet-style; dining capacity: 300+.



SARAH MAJOR LODGE As multi-level lakeside lodging, Sarah Major Lodge includes: a spacious meeting room with views of the lake on the main floor, a wood-burning fireplace, and a kitchenette; recreation/meeting area and kitchen located on the lower level; three bedrooms on the main level and five bedrooms on the upper level; and centrally located restrooms and showers. This lodge is heated. Overnight capacity: 61 summer setup/49 for most of the retreat season (35 are lower or single twin beds).



ULRICH HOUSE Ulrich House is a remodeled, multi-level retreat lodge filled with rustic charm and includes: a main floor meeting space with a kitchenette and a wood-burning fireplace; a main floor conference room connected to a kitchen; recreation/meeting area located on the lower level that walks out to a covered back porch; 14 total bedrooms on the main and upper levels; and restrooms on the main and upper levels. An elevator connects all three floors. This lodge has heating and air conditioning. Overnight capacity: 33 with one person per bed/48 with two people per full-size bed. No bunks.



WAMPLER RETREAT CENTER This lakeside retreat lodge includes: a cozy meeting area with a kitchen and a wood-burning fireplace; four carpeted bedrooms; centrally located restrooms and showers; and a wood deck with a view of the lake. This lodge has heating and air conditioning—overnight capacity: 20 (12 are lower or single twin beds).



MISSION VILLAGE YURTS The Mission Village wooden yurts are three-season retreat lodging that include: a central meeting yurt that can accommodate up to 45 people; heated restrooms with showers; and five lodging yurts all connected by a central boardwalk. Four yurts have 10 beds, and one has 3 to 6 beds. Overnight sleeping capacity: 45



SEASONAL CABINS Six three-season cabins accommodate up to 60 guests (W-cabins). These have heating capabilities and twin beds, not bunks. There are fourteen cabins available from May to September (E Cabins and Letter Cabins). These cabins have 5 bunks (10 twin beds) in each. These cabin circles can each hold up to 70 people, and they have a centrally located bathhouse (restrooms and showers) with a designated nearby campfire circle.
